Assault Victim Fights for Life

A 55 year old man is today fighting for his life in Royal North Shore Hospital after being transferred from Wiimali Community Hospital yesterday. He was found unconscious in the Wiimali Park, Main St. He was found at 11 am lying in some trees but within a few yards of the busy main road. He is believed to have suffered head injuries caused by an assault during the night. He is thought to be homeless and has no known address or identity. Wiimali Police are appealing for anybody who may know something about the man to contact them



immediately. Sergeant Alan (Wiimali District Police) said this is one of a series of attacks occurring in or near the park, fuelled in part by drinking and drugs.
